



Documentation for a civil wedding in Ierokípiá Municipality

THIRD COUNTRY CITIZENS RESIDENTS IN CYPRUS

Regarding your civil marriage in Ierokipia Municipality and in addition to the documents you are requested to submit according to your nationality, a third country national that resides permanently in Cyprus must also submit a Non Impediment certificate issued by the Civil Registry and Migration Department, by submitting the following documents.

1. Completed application form signed by the applicant.
2. Temporary residence permit the validity of which should not be less than one month the day of the application for a non-marriage certificate. If the validity of Temporary residence permit is less than a month (even one day) the applicant must submit receipt of payment of a new application for a temporary residence permit in the Republic of Cyprus.
3. Affidavit that clearly describes his marital status (single/divorced/widow). In case of divorce or widowhood must be stated that the applicant has not been married since the divorce/death of his spouse. The Affidavit should also state the name of the person with whom he intends to get married.
4. Non-marriage certificate from the competent authority of the country of origin of the applicant with an official translation into English and duly certified.
5. In case of divorce, a divorce certificate (final) with an official translation into English and duly certified.
6. In the event of widowhood, death certificate of his spouse with an official translation into English and duly certified.
7. Birth certificate with an official translation into Greek/English.
8. Valid passport.

Please note that all public documents issued abroad must:

a) bear an official translation into English by a sworn translator.

b) be certified with Apostille if the country has signed the Hague Convention of 1961 or Certified by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the country of origin of the applicant and then by the Embassy/Consulate of Cyprus in his country and then certified by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Cyprus.

In the instance that the country of origin of the applicant has not signed the Hague Convention of 1961 and there is no Embassy /Consulate in the above mentioned country, the documents must be certified by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the country of origin of the applicant, then by the Embassy/Consulate of the issuing country in a third country, then by the Cypriot Embassy/Consulate in that third country and final by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Cyprus.
